

PREFACE:

But inspite of the growing population of this industrial township and nearby areas around it, there is a dearth of educational facilities in this area for women education in higher level. To keep pace with the rapidly progressing society of the modern age, no endeavour will emerge sustainable without gender empowerment through education of the most important component of the society – the womenfolk. Duliajan Girls' College, was established in 1992 to fulfil this need to facilitate up-to-date education in well-equipped infrastructure to the womenfolk of Duliajan and neighboring areas readying them for the challenge of the society as better human beings. With constant good results, as the second institute of women education in the entire district, the college has succeeded in its effort in contributing towards women education in this area. As an elite women educational institution of this area, the college has been able to gather strong patronization and cooperation from Oil India Limited, Assam Gas Company Ltd., the public of the locality and from the guardians since its establishment. At present, the college has 30 qualified and experienced teachers along with about 15 nos. of hard-working office staff and above 800 students. The college is able to show brilliant performances in the Final Board & University Examinations. Duliajan Girls' College is well equipped with a very good arrangement of class rooms with modern teaching audio-visual aids, a big Digital library with a reading room, along with a few journals of national and regional level, and handful of News Papers in Assamese, English & Hindi language. The library is also well equipped with adequate nos. of reference books. The College has an Auditorium with a sitting capacity for about 500 peoples. The College also has a well-maintained canteen with good service and nutritious food. and care is taken to maintain utmost hygiene. Adequate sitting arrangement are there for both teachers & students separately. Laboratory facilities for both Education & Home Science Dept. with sufficient equipment's along with running water, electricity and gas supply is made available for students. The Computer Lab is equipped with sufficient nos. of computers, printers along with Internet facilities for teachers & students alike. The College has a provision of a Girls' Common Room for the recreation of the students. The construction of a permanent hostel for about 100 student's capacity is in progress.





Attendance



LIBRARY AND LIBRARY RULES

- (i) The Library of the College is well equipped with Chinese Books, Reference Books, Journals, Newspapers, Periodicals and Question Papers. However, the Reference Books, Journals and Question Papers are not issued to the students.
- (ii) Library cards are issued by the Librarian and a student can keep a library book for 2 days only. And overdue charge of Rs. 2/- per day will be charged if books are kept beyond the due time.




